Gerunds vs Infinitives Teacher's Notes



Level: Intermediate

In this activity sheet, students learn about the different uses of Gerunds and to-Infinitives by practising their use, both alone and with a partner.

Aim: To teach students the differences between Gerunds and Infinitives.

Exercise A: Students begin by completing the sentences using the correct Gerund or Infinitive.

Exercise B: Next, students decide which verbs can be used with Gerunds, which can be used with Infinitives, and which can be used with both Gerunds and Infinitives, and put them in the correct categories.

Exercise C: Students go on to complete the sentences by circling the correct form of the verb.
